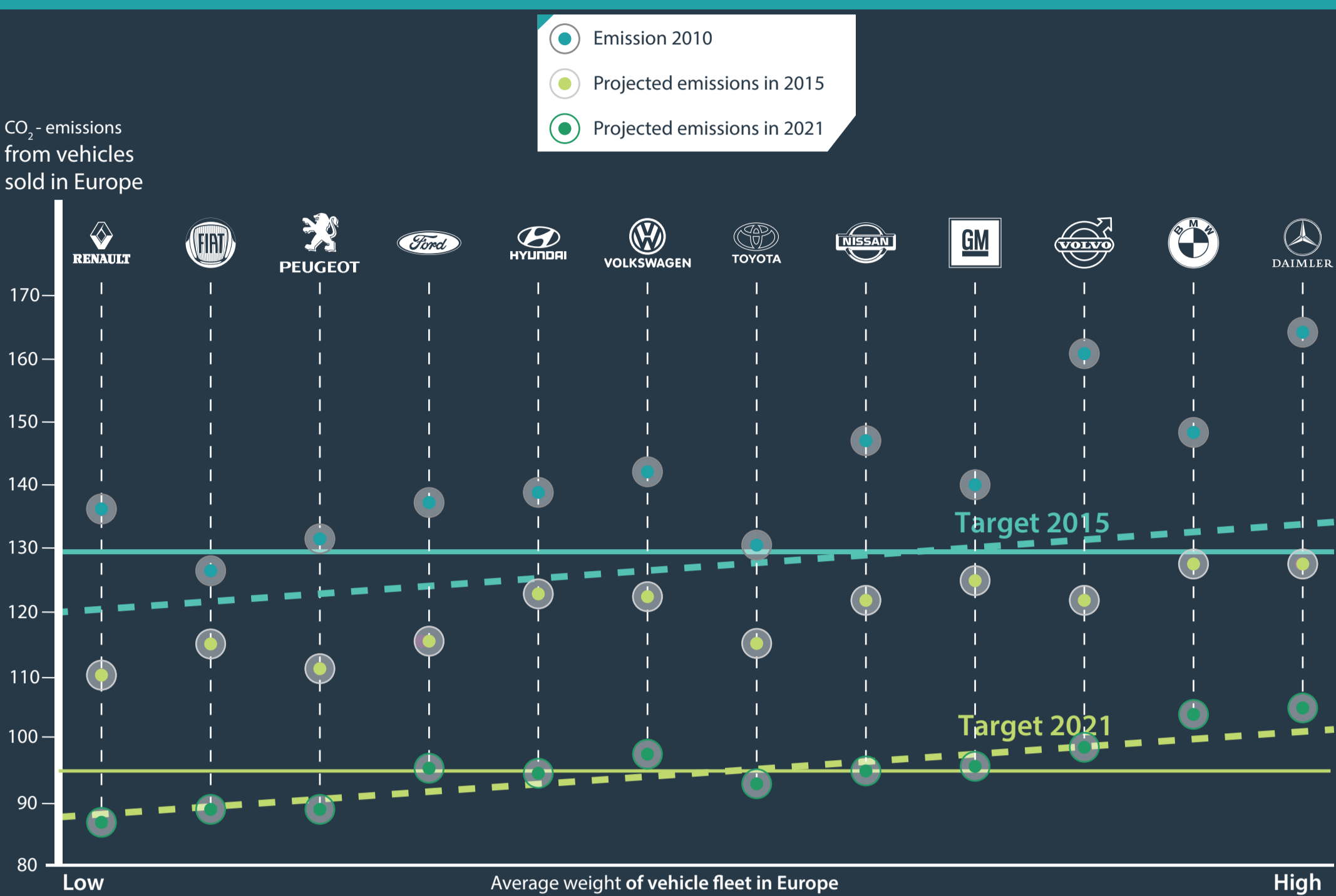


Are European carmakers failing to meet EU's CO₂ emission demands? 🌱

The year 2015 marks another milestone for the European emission targets. According to PA Consulting Group all OEMs will meet their targets for 2015 with an CO₂ emission average of 130 g CO₂ / km. However, the overall EU target of 95g CO₂ / km in 2021 will be much more challenging! Each manufacturer has its own individual target, depending on their European vehicle fleet. Additionally, so called super-credits for certain light vehicles will be part of equation.



Eight OEMs are expected to fail to meet the EU emission targets in 2021. They could face massive penalties and fines from around of 100 Million Euros (e.g. BMW) to over 1 Billion Euros (e.g. Daimler).
